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Lifehouse Embraces Growth

Lifehouse was founded in 1954 as a preschool, supporting 18 children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD). Since that time, the organization has grown dramatically, now supporting over 360 people in a variety of programs specially designed for them. Lifehouse now employs close to 500 staff to meet the growing needs in our community. The growth in individuals supported is reflected in the significant increase in our budget, which has grown from \$3M in FY2000 to \$28M in FY2020. Lifehouse is proud to be the largest agency in the San Francisco Bay Area supporting people with I/DD and providing innovative support services for our community.

During the pandemic, Lifehouse has continued to support our community and has accepted additional individuals. With Day Programs closed, Lifehouse has hired and trained over 130 new staff to respond to the increased demand for daytime support. We have been able to provide support to 31 of the 60 new referrals received in the past year.

The majority of Lifehouse staff are direct support professionals. They are the backbone of the organization. We have developed a curriculum of 30 employee trainings that range from Health and Wellness to Philosophy and Best Practices and are looking forward to fully utilizing the Training Center in the new Lifehouse building for collaboration and innovation. Please join us in this historic effort to ensure the programs and services that Lifehouse provides continue to enrich our community.

Christine Staff Leider Spotlight

Christine Leider joined Lifehouse in 2019 as the QIDP/Administrator for the three ICF (Intermediate Care Facility) homes. Since she joined Lifehouse, the ICF Homes have seen the quality of care improve, especially as each resident's support services are more personcentered as a result of Person Centered Thinking practices being applied throughout Lifehouse. She loves working with the people we support and her dedication can be seen in her work in the homes and at Lifehouse.

Over the last year, Christine and her team faced various challenges as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The ICF homes are required to follow the strictest rules, regulations and policies regarding COVID-19 due to each home being licensed by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and because long term care facilities were some of the hardest hit programs. Two of the biggest challenges Christine faced has been writing the COVID-19 policies, implementing them and keeping them up to date to reflect changing regulations from CDPH, as well as the increased amount of COVID-19 reports that are required to be submitted on a daily basis to CDPH and on a weekly basis to Marin County Public Health.

Christine has created comfortable and healthy living environments that support the ICF residents while maintaining COVID-19 protocols. We are happy to announce that none of the ICF residents were diagnosed with COVID-19, and that the majority of the residents are now fully vaccinated! Thank you to Christine and the ICF team for fostering an environment where residents remain safe and healthy!

Volunteer Erin Spotlight Uesugi



Erin Uesugi, mom to Sophie who is supported by Lifehouse, has been a steadfast advocate of Lifehouse since 2017 when Sophie joined Lifehouse. She immediately made herself available for volunteer opportunities. In 2019, we began a capital campaign to purchase and renovate a building in San Rafael to become the new Lifehouse headquarters. The building needed a complete renovation to accommodate the growing staff as well as the training needs to best serve the individuals we support.

As the Principal of Uesugi & Associates Architects in San Francisco, Erin happily volunteered her architectural services to re-design the 50-year-old building to accommodate Lifehouse. Erin met with the Lifehouse Executive Team to hear our office needs and desires for the space. She then developed a plan for the space that would accommodate our growing team. During the entirety of the project, Erin assisted in property evaluation, programming, conceptual design, fit plans and documents, and the permitting process. She also coordinated the overall work effort with multiple consultants that included civil engineers, structural engineers, architects and construction manager. We are truly grateful for Erin's amazing design work for the new Lifehouse headquarters. The entrance lobby has been named in honor of her architectural firm. We look forward to working with Erin for many years to come.

Person Centered Thinking

Claudia Silva, Quality Assurance & Training Specialist Kate O'Connor, Director of Programs & Operations



The core of Lifehouse services is guided by Person Centered Thinking (PCT), which is a set of structured skills to help people discover things that are important to them and make decisions based on how they can have positive control over their life. Claudia Silva, the Quality Assurance & Training Specialist, leads this effort along with Kate O'Connor, the Director of Services & Operations. Kate builds Lifehouse's capacity to expand PCT training to the agency, and Claudia, a certified Person Centered Thinking Trainer, provides the trainings and planning services.

The Person Centered Thinking Training, led by Claudia, is taught in modules over 18 hours. Our goal is to train all Lifehouse staff so that they have the knowledge to help the people we support to achieve their goals and learn how to support personal choice while addressing issues of health and safety. We are excited to announce that we now offer this training to the community at large and to our partners who support people with developmental disabilities.

Lifehouse is also certified to provide Person Centered Planning (PCP) services as contracted by the Golden Gate Regional Center (GGRC) to support the individuals enrolled in the Self Determination Program (SDP). PCP is a process to help individuals make decisions toward a desired future and develop meaningful life goals based on their strengths. Through the use of PCT, a highly customized plan is developed to direct services that are desired by the person. When Lifehouse receives a referral,

Claudia will meet with the individual and identify what is important in their life. She then facilitates the development of a plan that will help the person supported in making personal choices, develop meaningful goals and the actions needed to achieve them, as well as finding ways to best support them in their services. The planning meetings are a collaborative process directed by the person receiving services in partnership with the PCP facilitator and his/her circle of support.

Lifehouse also received Home & Community Based Services compliance funding towards PCT coaching. An outside consultant trained 25 Lifehouse Managers, Assistant Managers, and Direct Support staff in PCT and how to coach others in PCT. The goal is to spread the reach throughout the agency and develop an ongoing coaching group where coaches support their colleagues and the people we support in using the PCT model, discuss what is working and not working, and how to best support our residents in making their own choices. The coaching group will consist of Managers, Assistant Managers, and Direct Support staff. The consultant also held a Person Centered Planning facilitation training with Managers and Directors on how to help the people we support create their own plan based on their own choices. We are excited to see the expansion of PCT throughout Lifehouse so that all the people we support have an opportunity to live in the most positive way.

Prader-Willi Program

Lifehouse is excited to undertake the development of a team skilled in supporting individuals with Prader-Willi Syndrome (PWS). PWS is a non-inherited genetic disorder, often associated with an abnormality of the Chromosome 15, which causes a multitude of serious and life-threatening conditions. The hallmark symptoms are the impaired ability to control emotions and behavior as well as hyperphagia, which is the insatiable biochemical drive to eat. Although people with PWS feel a constant drive to eat, they experience a metabolism that slows to about half of the normal rate. This can lead to morbid obesity and premature death.

Lifehouse has provided services to individuals with this diagnosis within its Supported Living Program and has recognized that in some instances, traditional services have fallen short of offering adequate support. One needed ingredient is for staff members to "lend control" when the person supported is overwhelmed, often due to the symptoms of emotional dysregulation and hyperphagia. This is done through a combination of treatment and management strategies, with food and behavior management as a key component of the service plan.

Environments that are predictable, positive and limited in stress are frequently the best atmosphere of support for individuals with PWS. Locally, the Prader-Willi Homes of California (PWHC) purchased a home that will have four tenants with PWS who will begin receiving support in the summer to early fall. Austin and Leslie de Lone are the founders of this non-profit whose mission includes establishing and maintaining homes that serve people with PWS. Lifehouse has been in conversation with the de Lones and PWHC Executive Director John McCue on ways to potentially partner to match Lifehouse's staffing and support services with the PWHC housing arrangement. BJ Goff, a renowned PWS expert and consultant who is a professor at Westfield State University in Massachusetts and has vast experience operating several programs for PWS, is providing consultation with Lifehouse to guide in the creation of a framework for success in supporting individuals with PWS.

Embarking on meeting this community need, Lifehouse is investing in staff training with Goff and through PWCF. We are excited to be able to offer services that are needed in the community. 
